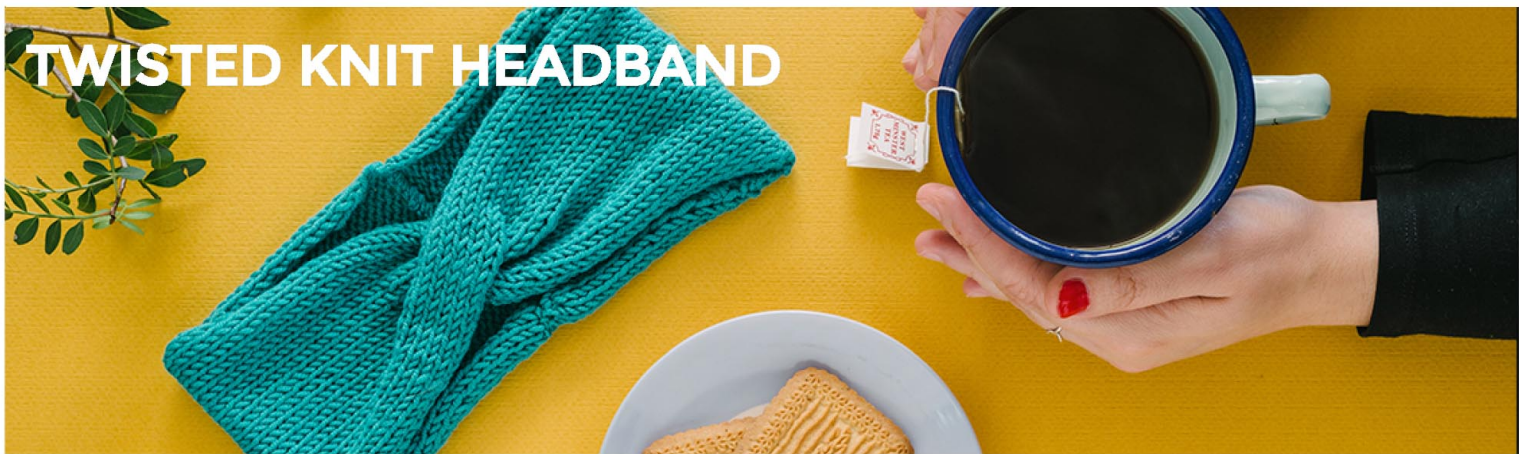


TWISTED KNIT HEADBAND



Just because you need to layer doesn't mean they shouldn't be fashionable and an expression of you. Our soft 100% merino wool yarn will keep you warm and cozy this winter season, and did we mention soft??

Materials

1-50g ball of DMC Woolly, color 074

4.5 mm knitting needles

Cable needle

Scissors

Measuring tape

DMC yarn needle

Abbreviations

K - Knit

P - Purl

Cast on 24 stitches.

Row 1: K1, P22, K1.

Row 2: P1, K22, P1

Repeat Rows 1-2 until you knit half the length of your headband.

End by working a Row 1 so you're ready to cable in STEP 3.

When should I stop? How long should my headband be?

Our headband is 46cm long, so we stopped at 23cm .

Here's how to calculate yours.

1. Measure your head where you'll place your headband.
2. A headband needs to stretch to stay in place. Subtract 5 to 7cm depending on how snug you'd like it to be. That's the total length of your headband.
3. Divide the number by two - the halfway point.

My head circumference _____ cm minus 5 to 7cm = _____ divided by 2 = _____ cm

Cable Row: P1, CF22 (slip 11 stitches onto your cable needle and hold them to the front of the work, K11 stitches from the left needle, then the K11 from your cable needle), P1.

Continue working headband by repeating Row 1 and 2 from STEP 2 until the headband fits comfortably and snug around your head. Bind off.

Using a yarn needle, seam the cast on and bind off edges together. Weave in the ends.
